



The problem

We need more social and affordable housing than ever before




But we're creating **less** social housing in NSW than we were a decade ago



It means that too many people in NSW don't have a home they can afford

Housing in NSW needs repair



THE SOLUTION

To help ensure everybody in has a home they can afford, now and over the next 20 years, NSW will need **212,000** new social housing homes by 2036

Registered community housing providers are part of the solution

By 2016 we made sure:

- **4 out of 5** of new tenancies are provided to people in the greatest need.
- **60,000** are living in community housing they can afford

By 2020 we'll have invested **\$1 billion** in new properties for tenants who need them and **84%** of our tenants are satisfied with their service.

We're ready do even more.
